The Gospel of God Romans 1:1-7

You can see the importance of the Book of Romans by looking at your table of contents in the NT. Romans follows Acts which follows the gospels. Romans is the first in the section of letters to the Church because it is the most comprehensive and the most important of all the letters. 1 Thessalonians was the first letter to the Church. Romans was written about 6 years later.

Simple overview of the early books of the New Testament to help you see how Romans fits:

In the gospels, salvation is obtained. In the Book of Acts, salvation is proclaimed. In the Book of Romans, salvation is explained.

Romans is commonly viewed as a heavy theological book. It has great theology, but I suggest that the goal of Romans is not merely information but transformation. Romans was written to change how people live – it addresses the mind, heart and will.

The Book of Romans in single phrase: Life Transformation through Jesus.

Romans makes it exceedingly clear that Jesus has paid the penalty of sin AND Jesus has defeated the power of sin. Salvation means - you are right with God. Salvation also means it is possible to be obedient to God rather than enslaved by sin.

The gospel is not advice to be followed. It is news about what has been done for you. Big difference. Sometimes Christians drift into – here's what you need to do. The gospel is here's what Jesus has done for you.
